



RECTOR'S MESSAGE



The fast spread of corona virus into every region of this world has disrupted normal human activity on Planet Earth. COVID-positive patients are isolated from human contacts. Those who had contact with the patients are quarantined. Countries around the world have sealed borders, imposed strict travel restrictions and enforced social distancing norms. Markets, malls, cinema halls, places of worship and children's play areas are closed. The Healthcare system is overwhelmed by stress. Revenues in all sectors have nosedived and the global economy is headed towards the worst recession. The hardest hit is the Education sector. The study conducted by UNESCO and UNICEF suggests that more than 1.5 billion children of all ages around the world have experienced interruption of education due to this crisis. Not even during the times of war, civil unrest, famine or strikes, has the world witnessed an interruption in education of this magnitude. As the education system is undergoing a tectonic shift due to COVID - 19, students, teachers and parents are facing multiple challenges. Students are deprived of peer interactions and personal accompaniment of teachers which is important for their social, emotional and cognitive development. Too many online classes leading to regular exposure to electronic screens has affected the physical and psychological wellbeing of several students. As the traditional "chalk and talk" teaching model has given way to online learning, teachers are challenged to adapt quickly to the new paradigm in education. The "digital immigrants" are compelled to teach the "digital natives" in the digital environment in the new system. The Parents – especially the working parents – feel deeply distressed by this crisis. Along with the parenting roles and professional duties, they are struggling to play the role of educators and facilitators of the learning of their children.

The unprecedented challenges posed by COVID -19 have evoked a wide range of responses among different people. While some are anxious and overwhelmed, some others are resilient. I am happy to place on record that under the able leadership of Fr. Sunil Fernandes, Principal, St. Joseph's Boys High School has responded to the present crisis with a positive mindset and resilience. I am grateful to our dedicated staff and the ever supportive parents of our students. They have worked as a team and created "collaborative learning spaces" to nurture the potential of our students. I wish and pray that guided by the motto of our school – "Fide et Labore" (Faith and Toil), we may continue to cooperate, coordinate and collaborate in novel and creative ways to promote the holistic development of our students



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Annual Report 2019-2020

Run by the Society of Jesus it is quite apparent that education, ministry and outreach to the marginalised have been at the core of the Jesuit mission. Animated by the spiritual vision of their founder, St. Ignatius of Loyola and directed by the ethos of looking after the lost, the last and the least, the Jesuit Fathers continue to profoundly influence the thinking and character of every Josephite, and the society at large. Nurtured by the motto of 'Faith and Toil', every man and woman who walks out of these gates, having had a holistic development, is committed to the service of others and to a faith that does justice in the world.

We welcome you to join us as we highlight some of the major events of the colourful mosaic that has formed an integral part of the academic year 2019-2020.

'Change is inevitable. Change is constant' said Benjamin Disraeli. The school joyfully welcomed the new Principal Rev. Fr. Sunil Cletus Fernandes, an extremely competent and efficient leader, who would no doubt lead the school to great heights.

It was the ancient Greek philosopher Aristotle who said, "We are what we repeatedly do. Excellence, then, is not an act, but a habit." We dare to boast, albeit with humility, of yet another year of academic excellence with a 100% pass percentage in the ICSE and ISC results. Hardik Jajodia topped the ICSE section with 98.5%. Ranking second was Lewis Jesudhas and Siddh Nagori with 97.5%). T.R.Puneet stood third, scoring 97.33%.

The ISC results were also noteworthy. In the Science stream, Vedhas Balaji in first place scored 98.25%. In second place was Manali Mahendra Barve who scored 97.25%. Rhea Pinto and Samyuktha Santosh scoring 97%, stood third.

In the Commerce stream, Gunjan P Khanted got the first rank with 98.25%. Niharika Jajodia, Sarthak Modi and Kunal Gadiya tied at 97.5% to get the second rank.

Dreams become reality through sweat, determination and hard work. Perseverance and achievement is always recognised and rewarded. The Annual Speech and Prize Day for the primary and senior section was well attended and the prize-winning children given due recognition.

"Go forth and set the world on fire" said the great visionary, St. Ignatius of Loyola - the Founder of the Society of Jesus, who is the inspiration and force behind the extraordinary selfless work of the Jesuits. July saw a week long celebration of this great man of influence.

Education in Joseph's is based on the Ignatian Pedagogical Paradigm which is founded on the belief that education has to go beyond the mere transmission of information from teacher to student. Rather than an exercise in memorization, education is meant to be a transformational experience that affects the students on all levels - not only cognitive, but also emotional and behavioural. Hence, along with an interactive, collaborative and informative curriculum that forms the very basis of the academia, the teacher has a very crucial role in the process. While debates, discussions, sport and creative activity provides a holistic approach, power point presentations and the digital smartboard-aided teaching, foster academic genius.

Various co-curricular and extracurricular activities rooted in the sciences, kindles in our students a curiosity and wonder which leads to an insatiable thirst for knowledge. The many internationally recognized scientists who have walked out of these gates into a future of opportunity, bears testimony to this.

Over 1200 participants from 36 schools participated in the third edition of the Annual Science and Technology Fest Transcendence. It is a matter of immense pride to have had an exalted personality, a 'Bharat Ratna', Professor C.N.R.Rao as the chief guest for the opening ceremony. The 2nd edition of the intra-school Science Fests Eucranium and Infinity witnessed over 600 students auditioning for various events ranging from quizzing and model making to debating and treasure hunt.

The seventh edition of SJBHS Model United Nations saw 22 schools participating with 338 delegates in the fray. The event held much promise towards bringing to the fore, ideas of the youth, and solutions to global issues.

The third edition of our annual inter-school/college commerce fest Bifrost was successfully held and witnessed enthusiastic participation in varied aspects of marketing, finance, human resources and public relations.

The hugely popular carnival-cum-literary and cultural festival of SJBHS, **Phenomenon 2019**, was a superb success. Over 200 schools participated in the 36 interesting events offered. High profile DJ's entertained the large crowds gathered.

Addressing the critical need for cyber security, a workshop was conducted by KPMG ethical hacker Soni Mathew and his team. Not only did they make thestudents aware of the realities of the virtual world, but they also analysed and discussed cyber-bullying and the role of cyber cells in solving cyber-crimes

For the first time in the school, **Cadence**, the St Joseph's Inter-school Music Festival, was celebrated. It witnessed large, enthusiastic participation from schools all over Bangalore.

E-Lit 2019, the annual English Literary Festival, was organized by the English department. It featured a whole range of events from Book Illustration and Debate to Product Advertisement. The E-Lit fest not only developed the creative and the literary dimension of the students, but also gave the students an opportunity to hone their organizational skills.

The LKG and UKG students had a number of 'Fun Days' when they celebrated the family, the seasons and the country's diversity in a colourful fun-filled way. The students from LKG to Std 4 got an opportunity to showcase their myriad talents in Chilgala 2019 where they took part in a number of competitions that included music, dance, fancy dress, Origami and clay modelling. Annual Day, as always, was a riot of colour and a burst of energy and enthusiasm, when the students of LKG to Std 4 put up an enthralling cultural programme.

It is said that it is in the roots, not the branches that a tree's greatest strength lies, for if you know where you are from, it is harder for people to stop you where you are going. **Grameena Utsava**, the brainchild of Fr. Sunil Fernandes, was organised for the first time and was a resounding success earning much appreciation and praise. The complete school turned into a village, and sound, colour, and excitement permeated the atmosphere. Our city-bred children discovered and experienced the joys of rural life and village games. We were honoured to have a very special person, 108 year old Padma Shree winner SaalumaradaThimmakka, and local MLA Shri N. A. Haris as the Chief Guests.

The threat of global warming, greenhouse gases, acid rain and imbalance in nature is real and already beginning to manifest itself in violent tsunamis, raging forest fires, unprecedented rain and extreme weather conditions in various parts of the globe. Josephites, from the Primary to the ISC Section, are all too familiar with these rapid and frightening changes and are doing their bit for the environment. Viridiscence or Go Green Week, with a special focus on e-waste, worked towards increasing sustainability and saving the planet which is increasingly choking on digital waste. The OBA Innovation Lab programme for students from Std 8 to 12, sought to encourage scientific enquiry and served to inspire children to hone their critical thinking skills while promoting greater social awareness. The programme was a great success, thanks to the dedicated effort of our Old Boys.

Hindi Diwas was celebrated with gusto and prizes awarded for competitions held in Recitation Competition, Singing, Debate, Creative Writing, and Speech. The Interactive **History Exhibition** titled 'Bangalore and the Partition' was interesting and informative.

Through the Plastic Beku initiative, 92.7 Big FM partnered with Kempegowda International Airport, and FMCG major ITC's Foods Division, to work with St Joseph's Boys' High School, to sensitize students towards the need for an eco-friendly life. The "Plastic Beku" campaign to collect plastic waste, which will be used to pave a 50 km road from Kempegowda International Airport, was kicked off.

From Hakimuddin to Rehan Poncha, Rahul Dravid to Anup Shridhar, the school has made an indelible mark on the national and international scene, with at least ten Olympians, six National Hockey players and three International cricketers.

A state-of-the-art sports complex and the core philosophy of a holistic education that includes games and sports, is what sets this iconic institution apart from all others. Students are guided and encouraged to hone their sporting talent, through various clubs like Aquatic/ Swimming, Taekwondo, Table Tennis, Badminton, Basketball, Cricket, Football, Hockey and Sports Shooting.

There is no dearth of **sporting talent**. Our sportsmen have been raking in laurels. In the CISCE Regional Sports & Games 2019 Swimming Championship, the SJBHS Swimming U-14 team won second place.

In the finals of the prestigious annual inter-school Hockey tournaments, SJBHS clinched a double victory. In the Fr Eric Vaz Memorial U-14 tournament SJBHS beat FAPS, and in the Centenary Shield U-17 tournament SJBHS beat Vidyashilp Academy.

Grit, stamina and endurance was put to the test when, with the active support of the PTA, Triathlon 2019, a triad of three phases: 50m swimming, 1.2 km cycling and 200m running race, was conducted as a single non-stop event. With 105 students participating, the event was a resounding success.

The Annual Sports Day for juniors and seniors had, as always, a festive air and saw active and enthusiastic participation. Our young talented swimmers made waves at the Annual Aquatic Meet.

Following Ignatian tradition, the Jesuits and the staff and students are nurtured to become 'contemplatives in action'—women and men committed to the service of others. 'MAGIS'- The Jesuit principle of 'more' simply translates into going beyond ones call of duty, empowered with a moral and social consciousness to serve society at large, dedicated to the service of faith and promotion of justice. Various opportunities through the year encourage students to be not only academically competent, but also unselfish in the service of their fellow men and women.40 SJBHS staff members led by Fr. Alwyn D'Souza SJ visited St. Joseph's PU College Anekal, as part of the BJES-Anekal Twinning Programme. The SJBHS Twinning Programme took on a more scientific hue with a visit to Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Advanced Scientific Research (JNCASR), a multidisciplinary scientific research institute situated in Jakkur along with Loyola PU College, Manvi-Raichur and St Joseph's PU College, Anekal.

In a solemn **Investiture ceremony**, the newly elected office bearers were sworn-in marking the change of guard. The **Valedictory** Ceremony for the students of standard 10 and 12 was a solemn and grand occasion. A beautiful and meaningful ceremony following the time-honoured tradition of the school, it shall surely be a memory the outgoing batches would cherish for a long time to come. Imparting spiritual guidance and direction to Catholic students, the CLC played an important role. In keeping with the secular fabric of the School,Inter Religious Prayer Services and a special Harmony Week was held, celebrating the concept of 'Harmony with Self' which forms the basis for peace, reconciliation, integrity and solidarity.By inculcating a spirit of tolerance among the students they are encouraged to grow in a spirit of harmony and brotherhood.

Growth and development through orientations and seminars are an integral part of the school year. 



ANNUAL AQUATIC MEET MAKING A SPLASH!







Dr Debmita said parents' attitude had to change with the age of the child. They have to guide the child at home and get them ready to deal with certain routines that will help them to cope.

He inspired all the participants into the pursuit of Science, which included 'asking questions, developing curiosity, applying knowledge', and ultimately 'solving problems'. He reminisced Professor C.V. Raman addressing his school decades ago, and how that inspired him to be 'involved and excited every single day' in his profession.

He advised the students that a profession in science required tremendous 'dedication, passion, and patience', for the 'service of humanity'.

VISIT TO THE STATE ARCHIVES

The History Club, formed with the objective of going beyond the textbook and learning about historical places, people, events and things, decided to conduct its visit to the State Archives situated in the south entrance of the Vidhan Soudha.

40 students along with their teachers, Ms Gowri MirlayAchanta and Ms Evelyn Priya, were welcomed by the Director, Dr Ambujakshi, and other members of her department, who willingly shared their vast knowledge with the students and teachers.

Dr Ambujakshi explained that all official documents from 1799 have been preserved in these Archives and treated with great care. Each page is covered in very fine tissue paper thus protecting the page but still ensuring that the writing is visible. The books and documents are treated with chemicals every three months in order to preserve them. The Director explained that in order to write History one has to have credible evidence - provided by original documents.

The documents in our Archives pertain to the rule of the Mysore Maharaja, the British rule and Post Independence Government records. Many of these documents have been digitized and are preserved in the form of micro films.

Dr Ambujakshi proudly displayed the original Treaty which was drawn after the Fourth Anglo Mysore War in 1799. It was thrilling to see the huge



pages, the beautiful calligraphy both in English and in the court language, Persian. The Imperial seal could be seen clearly and it looked very well preserved. The students were shown documents with the signature of Sir M Vishveshvariah the Dewan of Mysore.

The Director invited the students to visit the Archives again. The staff and students were very grateful for the knowledge gained through this trip and look forward to another visit.

GROWING IN EMPATHY

On their very first outreach for the academic year, on 29th June, 2019, CLC boys were filled with concerns, questions and a lot of excitement. They were on their way to Jeevarathini - Home for abandoned children, at Nallur Village, Hosur Road. They were welcomed with enthusiasm.



The winning teams qualified to participate in the world-wide finale which was to be conducted in US.Unfortunately, owing to the current pandemic situation worldwide, this fell through. 
Pre-Primary School Annual Day BIG MOMENTS; SMALL PEOPLE!

A NATURE WALK TO REMEMBER

30 students from 7th and 8th grade visited Jakkur Lake on 30 Nov 2019. The trip was organised by the school's Go Green committee, in an effort to increase student awareness on sustainable practices and to understand their roles and duties towards the environment.

The lake is managed by a citizen action group called Jal Poshan which has cleaned and maintained the lake since 2014. Ms. Annapurna who leads the group gave the boys a seminar on the work done by the group and explained how cleaning up of a lake starts at home. She explained how plastics have pervaded our homes and taught us simple ways to eliminate its usage.

This was followed by a 3km walk around the lake where students got to witness the various flora and fauna of the place, the sewage treatment plant and storm water inlets. The water is then purified by plants in the wetland area to make up Bangalore's first Integrated Urban Water Management System.

We returned a little wiser, much energized, with a resolve to adopt a more sustainable way of life.

The go green committee will be submitting a proposal to visit lakes as a part of science projects, specifically Jakkur lake, where work is in progress. Students will have the opportunity to apply conceptual knowledge in understanding water chemistry, analysing lake ecosystems and innovating simple solutions using math and physics for cleaning and maintaining lakes.

VIRIDESCENCE

OBA REPORT 2019-2020



The year commenced with the Managing Committee for 2019-20 being elected into office on September 1, 2019. Ian Lewis of the Class of 1990 was elected President, Praveen Rodrigues of the Class of 1985 First Vice President and Rajeev Shenoy of the Class of 1996 the Second Vice President.

As a go-green initiative, no plastic was used during the tournament. For the first time, the tournament was held in an Inter-House format for the batches that passed out of School earlier than 1990. St. George's House reigned supreme in this category, while the teams representing the batches of 1991, 2007 and 2018 took the honours in their respective inter-batch categories.

In celebration of the Yule season, the OBA Christmas Dinner - 2019 was held on the evening of December 14, in parallel to the floodlit final matches of the football tournament. Over 100 Old Boys and their families participated in the evening that had Santa, carol-singing, a bonfire and also the prize distribution to the winners of the football tournament.

To induct the students passing out of Std 10 & 12 into the OBA, the Welcome to OBA – 2020 was held on January 21. The students were welcomed into the OBA's fold by President Ian Lewis. Sajju Jain, global serial entrepreneur and Old Boy of the Class of 1992, made an instant connect with his fellow Josephites with an inspiring declamation illustrating how 'Faith & Toil' has had a positive impact on his life. The students were handed a scroll of the School Song as a memento.

Anil Abraham of the Class of 1977 enthralled all with a stand-up comedy act over lunch. The Fr. Hedwig Da Costa Inter-House Golf Tournament Trophy was won by St. George's House, represented by Arjun Malik (1994), Sanal Skaria (1990), Prashant Sakhamuri (1977), Sanjeev Rakhra (1987), Rishi Mehra (1988), Chaitanya Harimohan (1999), Vikram Bihani (1990), Sanjay Mathias (1990), Vikram Sahgal (1981) and Uttam Muthappa (1991). The Fr. Denis Coelho Memorial Inter-Batch Golf Tournament Trophy was won by the Batch of 1984, represented by C. C. Thimaiah and C. S. Madappa.

Two SJBHS OBA CONNECT events were held in the month of February - the SJBHS OBA-CONNECT - New Delhi 2020 on the 8th and 9th and the inaugural SJBHS OBA CONNECT - Chikmagalur-Hassan 2020on the 15th and 16th. The former was attended by 35 Old Boys and their families. Activities of the first day commenced with a round of golf, followed by lunch at the Hindan Air Force Base. The day concluded with a walking foodie tour around the Nizamuddin Auliya Dargah Complex at Hazrat Nizamuddin. On the second

day, Anuj Dayal, Old Boy of the Class of 1977 and Executive Director of Delhi Metro Rail Corporation, arranged a tour of the Control Room of Delhi Metro.

Over 60 Josephites, with around a dozen from the OBA Bikers' Group riding down from Bangalore, attended the SJBHS OBA CONNECT – Chikmagalur-Hassan 2020. In addition to dinner and fellowship at the Kadur Club, a round of golf at the Chikmagalur Golf Club and a visit to the World of Coffee Experience Café were organized. The event concluded with fellowship and brunch on the second afternoon.

The OBA Innovation Lab, spearheaded by Vijay Nazareth (1978), ran a successful programme for students of Std. 8 of the School. Reports on topics ranging from Illiteracy and Poverty, Awareness and Disposal of e-Waste, Water Scarcity and Conservation to Traffic Management and Safety were presented to students of Stds. 7 & 8 on February 24, 2020. The students were supported by their Class Teachers Mrs. Gowri Mirlay Achanta and Mrs. Reshmi lyer and the presentations were judged by Mrs. Neena Kulkarni, former Science Teacher at the School, Vijay Alphonse (1990) and Samir Stewart (1989). Certificates and plagues were distributed to the winners on February 25. The Innovation Lab programme has since been institutionalized and is being run by the School, with several Old Boys offering their support as mentors and in other capacities.



In the month of March, with the tentacles of the Covid-19 pandemic engulfing Bangalore, the BJES initiated a drive to support daily-wage earners and migrant workers across the city. The OBA supported the cause by extending an appeal to Old Boys, to which the response was overwhelming.

As a fallout of the pandemic, the remainder of the events that were planned for the year, viz. the Celebration of the Feast of St. Joseph (and the Saleh Ahmed SJBHS OBA Rink Hockey Tournament 4.0), JOSEXCEL - 2020, OBA Buzz - 2020, the Jimmy Anklesaria Inter-Batch Super Sixes Cricket Tournament 3.0, Basketball and Tri-Series Tournaments, Back to School, Blue & White Ball and Old Boys' Day had to be indefinitely postponed and then redlined. Unfortunate as it were, it was inevitable, given the situation that prevailed.

The pandemic-induced lockdown and sombreness notwithstanding, Josephites' innovative spirit came to the fore with an online chess tournament, SJBHS OBA Checkmate 1.0, being conceived and conducted between April 25 and 28, 2020. As many as 42 Old Boys from across the globe, ranging from the batches of 1969 to 2019, contested a total of 32 matches that took place over the four days. Vivek Nambiar of the Class of 1988 (St. George's) emerged victorious, with Sridhar Ramanujam of the Class of 1995

(St. Andrew's) coming in second and Varun Jalan of the Class of 2001 (St. Andrew's) finishing third.

The Chapters at Singapore, Kerala and Goa had laid out plans to host Old Boys at SJBHS OBA CONNECT events in these regions during the months of March, May and August respectively. Regrettably, all of these ended up as casualties of the pandemic. During the month of June, the nominations that came in for the OBA Achievement Awards were examined and Dr. S. Chinny Krishna (1959) and Dr Tacey Viegas (1973) were selected as winners of the OBA Lifetime Achievement Award and Gautam C. Ijoor (1989), Sajju Jain (1992), Sudhir Krishnaswamy (1991) and Vishwas Anand (2004) were selected to be recipients of the OBA Award for Significant Achievement. The awards will be presented to the victors on the forthcoming Old Boys' Day.

On September 6, 2020, the day on which Old Boys' Day was scheduled to be held, the Class of 1995 arranged a special Mass in commemoration of their 25th anniversary of passing out of School. The same was celebrated by Fr. Adrian Mascarenhas (Old Boy of the Class of 1994), Fr. Michael John, SJ (Principal of the School from 1993 to 2006), Fr. Sunil Fernandes, SJ (Principal) and Fr. Joel Fernandes, SJ (Administrator of the Primary Section).





Our Chapters at UK, Australia and North America kept the embers aglow:

The Old Josephites' Association, the reconstituted UK Chapter, arranged 2 get-togethers of Old Boys and Girls, with around 15 attending the initial meet-up held on September 28, 2019 and a similar number attending the Christmas Dinner held on December 7, 2019 at the Masala Zone Bayswater in London.

The Australia Chapter witnessed a revival - on January 26, 2020, Republic Day as well as Australia Day, 24 Old Boys and their families got together in Melbourne for a game of cricket and a barbeque lunch. Titled 'For Buck's Sake' in honour of Old Boy Roland 'Buck' Baker (Class of 1970) who recently expired, the event was attended by Old Boys from across batches - Dan Wallace of the Class of 1951 was the oldest Old Boy present and Roshan Chatterjee of the Class of 2012 was the youngest. The cricket match was played between combined house teams - St. Andrew's and St. David's against St. George's and St. Patrick's, with the former taking the spoils. Encouraged by the success and the 75-strong attendance, it has been planned to conduct the event annually.

The North America Chapter, in its new avatar as JAANA (Joseph's Alumni Association of North America) conducted a number of social and professional networking programmes over the year. The JAANA Speaker Series, a runaway success that featured Rahul Dravid (1989), Dr. Kartik Chandran (1989), Dr. Ragavendra R. Baliga (1975), Dr. Ash Rajan (1976), Sapna Karim, Prarthana Ramesh and Sabeer Bhatia (1984) was held on March 21, March 28, May 23, June 6 and June 27, 2020. Other programmes/initiatives that are on the anvil are The JAANA Mentoring Program, The JAANA Entrepreneurship Program, JAANA Connect - JAANA Content/LMS, The JAANA Professional Network, The JAANA Endowment and The JAANA Individual or Group Named Endowments. Each is designed with a specific purpose of assisting recent graduates, entrepreneurs, the School and other Old Boys and Girls in North America.





In perpetuation of the OBA's endeavour in supporting the Staff and Students of the School, several disbursements were made over the year:


- Rs. 16,01,859 towards Academic Scholarships



जगत में समय बड़ा बलवान

कोरोना, या कोविड-१९ वायरस के कारण सारे विश्व में दहशत का माहौल है। यह संक्रमण, किसी संक्रमित व्यक्ति के स्पर्ष या खाँसते-छींकते समय उसकी थूक की छींटों के छिड़काव से फैलता है। यह घातक विषाणु चीन की एक विषाणु प्रयोगशाला के किसी शोधकर्ता द्वारा रिसावित हुआ था। इस जानकारी को चीन ने अन्तर्राष्ट्रीय समुदाय से कई दिनों तक गोपनीय रखा। जब दूसरे देश इस बात से अवगत हुए, तब बहुत विलंब हो चुका था चूंकि यह वायरस लोगों में तीव्रता से फैलने लगा। बहुत जल्द, विश्व स्वास्थ्य संगठन ने इसे एक वैश्विक महामारी घोषित कर दिया।

जिन स्थानीय लोगों के अपने घर थे, वे अपने घरों में सुरक्षित रहकर अपनी जमा पूंजी से अपने परिवार का लालन-पालन करने लगे, जबिक जिनका कोई एक ठिकाना नहीं था वे बेचारे बेघर होकर मात्र दो वक़्त की रोटी अर्जित करने के लिए भी जूझते रह गए।

हालांकि कई स्वेच्छा संगठनों और सरकार ने अंतरिम राहत के उपाय निकाले, फिर भी असहाय श्रमिकों को अपने घरों की कमी की अनुभूति हो रही थी। जब इनकी सहनशीलता समाप्त होने लगी, तब कई लोगों ने हर हाल में अपने राज्य वापस लौटने हेतु पलायन करने का कठोर निर्णय लिया। कई लोगों ने अपने प्राण जोखिम में डालकर सीमा पार करके सैकड़ों मीलों की यात्रा, साइकल चलाकर या पैदल चलकर पूर्ण की।

प्रथम प्रतिबंध के दिन से लेकर आज तक चार माह बीत चुके हैं। कई कंपनियाँ इस वायरस से बचने के लिए अब भी टीके का अनुसंधान कर रही हैं। टीका बाज़ार में उपलब्ध होने में कदाचित दो माह लग जाएँ। विश्व का प्रत्येक नागरिक इस टीके की प्रतीक्षा कर रहा है।

नियति का यह कैसा खेल है जहाँ कोरोना से संक्रमित मृत शरीर को, न कोई छूना चाहता है और न ही उसका अंतिम संस्कार विधि-विधान से होने दे रहा है? यह समय के चक्र की कैसी दुष्कर अविध है, जब अपने बिछड़ गए हैं और अगले मिलन की घड़ी का कोई पता नहीं? कई ऐसे किस्से पढ़ने और सुनने को मिले हैं जहाँ सरकारी प्रतिबंधों के कारण लोग अपने घर तक पहुँचकर भी घर में प्रवेश नहीं कर पा रहे हैं। दूसरे राज्यों और विदेश से आने वालों को— चाहे अमीर हो या मध्यम वर्गी नागरिक— सरकारी नियमों के तहत अपने आप को संगरोध करने हेतु भारी रकमें चुकानी पड़ रही हैं।

अधिकतम आर्थिक गतिविधियों पर प्रतिबंध लगने के कारण, सभी व्यापार ठप्प हो गए हैं। फलतः बेकारी बढ़ गयी है और आर्थिक विकास पर विराम लग गया है।

यह कैसी विडंबना है जहाँ समाज में घुल-मिलकर रहने वाला मनुष्य वायरस के भय से, आज अकेलेपन की चपेट में आ गया है और अपने ही घर में बंदी बनकर रह गया है। जिसे श्वास लेने तक का अवकाश नहीं था, आज वही, कोरोना से पीड़ित होकर हांफता हुआ अस्पताल में प्रत्येक श्वास की गिनती कर रहा है। एक दूसरे का आलिंगन कर प्रसन्नता बाँटने वाला मनुष्य, आज किसी भी व्यक्ति के समीप तक नहीं आ रहा।

संक्रमित व्यक्ति, सामाजिक वर्जना का पात्र भी बन गया है। उसे न तो घर में ठिकाना मिल रहा है और न ही किसी स्वच्छ अस्पताल में प्रवेश। आज भी ऐसे मामले सामने आ रहे हैं जहाँ अस्पताल में प्रवेश निश्चित होने पर भी, एम्ब्लेंस की प्रतीक्षा करते रोगी के प्राण पखेरु उड़ जा रहे हैं।


