Rector's Message

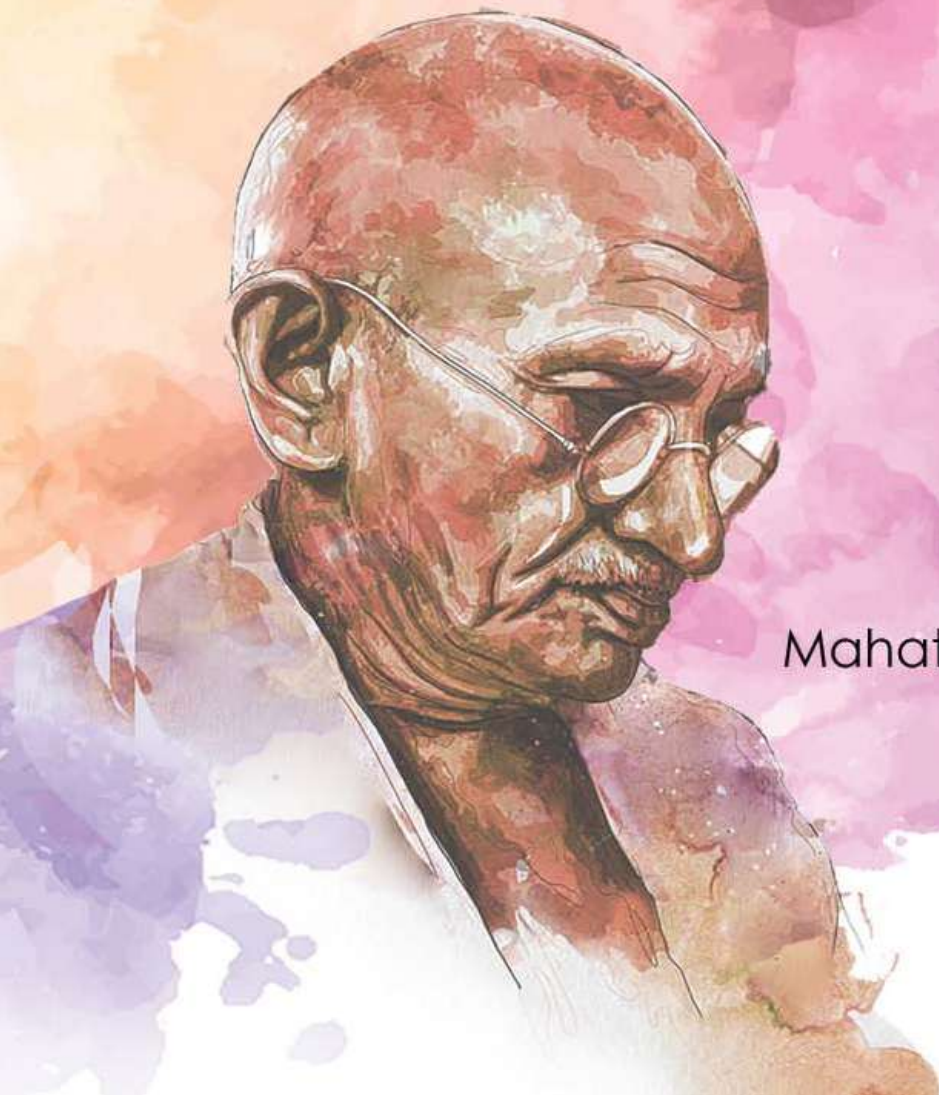

Annual Report 2022–2023

The terms Ignatian pedagogy, Jesuit education, and holistic development quite simply explain the high watermark of holistic education here. The level of excellence that the school has achieved over the past 165 years, shaping the character and personality of every student and making them responsible and ethical citizens, is well known and acknowledged. The global impact of our alumni, in every corner of the world, reflects the foundation they received here, and the ethos of this great institution. Run by the Jesuits, the teaching and core principles are guided by a spirituality that seeks justice and places great emphasis on forming ‘men and women for others.’ Enthused by the spiritual vision of their founder, St. Ignatius of Loyola, and directed by the ethos of looking after the lost, the last, and the least, the Jesuit Fathers continue to profoundly influence the thought and character not only of every Josephite but also of society at large. Nurtured by the motto “Faith and Toil” in a healthy environment of all-round development, every student who steps out into the world does so with confidence, shaped by holistic learning that has nurtured ‘out-of-the-box’ thinking and promoted secular thought.

We welcome you to join us as we highlight some of the major events of the colourful mosaic that has formed an integral part of the academic year 2022-2023.

We give thanks to God for his merciful blessings and rejoice in another year of academic excellence with 100% results in ICSE and 99.5% in the ISC examinations in 2023. Congratulations on the tremendous efforts of students, parents, staff, and administration throughout the academic year. In the ICSE exam, 262 students appeared for the exam. 214 students secured distinction, 41 secured a 1st class, and 7 students secured a 2nd class. The ICSE toppers are: in first place, Reehan Joseph Mathews with 98.83%; in second place, Aadam Aftab Tamboli with 98.5%; and in third place, Shishir Hande Handattu and Naman Aggarwal with 98.17%.

The toppers according to the national ranking, calculating the overall percentage of English + the best 3 subjects, are Reehan Joseph Mathews and Naman Aggarwal in 1st place with 99.2%, Aadam Aftab Tamboli and Ashrith Puppala in 2nd place with 98.6%, and Shishir Hande Handattu and Pujan Jain in 3rd place with 98.4%.

In the ISC Science section, out of 64 students who appeared, 48 students secured distinction and 16 students secured a first class.

The school toppers, according to the overall percentage of all 5 subjects, are Shreya Srivastava in 1st place with 96.6%, Kinshuk P ranked 2nd with 96%, and Harshith B stood 3rd with 95.4%.

The toppers according to the national ranking, calculating the overall percentage of English + the best 3 subjects, are Rayhan Hasan in 1st place with 98%, Shreya Srivastava and Kinshuk P in 2nd place with 97%, and Shrushti S in 3rd place with 96.25%. In the ISC Commerce section, out of 136 students who appeared, 126 students secured distinction, 7 students secured a first class, 2 students got a second class, and 1 student got a PCNA.

The school toppers, according to the overall percentage of all 5 subjects, are H. Antonius Godfrey in 1st place with 96%, Tanmayi Dasika in 2nd place with 95.8%, and Rahil A. Shah in 3rd place with 95.4%.

The toppers according to the national ranking, calculating the overall percentage of English + the best 3 subjects, are H. Antonius Godfrey in 1st place with 96.5%, Rahil A. Shah in 2nd place with 96.25%, and Sneha B. Shivashette in 3rd place with 96%.

A number of co-curricular and extracurricular activities rooted in science, technology, the world of commerce, business, and the arts kindle in our students a curiosity and wonder that leads to an insatiable thirst for knowledge. The many internationally recognised scientists, engineers, technocrats, sporting legends, and artists who have walked out of these gates into a future of opportunity bear testimony to this.

About 1000+ participants took part in the 6th edition of the Science and Technology Fest Transcendence. The chief guest of the opening ceremony was Dr. Sumati Surya from the Raman Institute, and the chief guest of the closing ceremony was Mr. V. Vasudevan, who delivered a speech enlightening the audience on ‘robotic surgery ecosystems in hospitals.’

A three-day intra-school science fest, Eucranium, conducted by the science department of SJBHS, unearthed the hidden creativity and fostered the quest for knowledge through a host of events to enable the students to bring out the best in their scientific exploration. Four eminent speakers took centre stage in a panel discussion that exposed the students to the world of physics, the world of mathematics, the world of biotechnology, and the intricacies of drug design for medical cure. The middle school Science, Math, and Art fest, Infinity 2022, was themed ‘Only One Earth’ and showcased prototypes, charts, and models that were innovative, creative, and pioneering. The art work as well as the models were based around the preservation, restoration, and conservation of Mother Earth.

The 6th edition of the International Commerce Fest Bifrost was conducted in a hybrid module. With over 30+ online, and over 400+ offline participants, the fest was a grand success. Maj. Allwyn D’souza and Mr. Ullas Kamath were the chief guests of the opening and closing ceremonies, respectively. Dr. Sandeep Ananthanarayanan was the speaker at the webinar.

The 4th season of the much-awaited music competition, Cadence, saw an overwhelming response with 32 schools registering for the competition. The chief guests were Dr. Maya Mascarenhas, the founder of “Bangalore Children’s Choir,” at the opening ceremony, and Mr. Alfonso

Tagliaferri, Consul General of Italy in Bengaluru, at the closing ceremony. The OBA successfully conducted the OBA Buzz. Held after a hiatus of three years, the competitions saw a record number of participants. The OBA managing committee 2021-2022 has installed a rolling trophy from this year onwards for the OBA Buzz.

Triathlon 2023, a single non-stop event comprising 50m swimming, 2.5 km cycling, and a 1.2 km running race, had the competitors display

The school was happy to get back to all its activities in full swing. The iconic Annual Athletic Meet 2022 was successfully conducted despite the unprecedented heavy rains that held Bangalore hostage. The OBA has also committed to engaging the students and teachers going forward with regular workshops and seminars around the year and warmly applaud the students and thank the management for their staunch support.

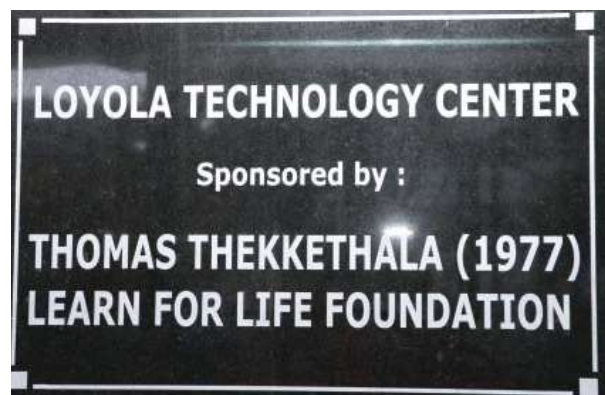


LOYOLA TECHNOLOGY CENTRE (LTC)

A New Tech Beginning

A new addition to the robust activities at St Joseph's Boys' High School is the Loyola Technology Centre. Sponsored by Thomas Thekkethala (Old Boy - batch of 1977) under the aegis of 'Learn for life Foundation', the centre aims to promote Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) education.

The LTC is a dynamic space which plans to bring the best in-house programmes and after-school workshops to students. The mission statement of this centre is to develop compassion and social responsibility with independent and inquisitive scientific minds.





The Loyola Technology Centre was launched at St Joseph's Boys' High School on 8 August 2022 with great enthusiasm and had the students of Class 9 to 12 as the audience, benefactors and stakeholders of STEM education in SJBHS.

The keynote speakers Mr. Thomas Thekkethala and Mrs. Asha Sunderarajan shared their ideas about the importance of real-life experiences in innovation, the exposure required to generate drive and curiosity in young minds and stressed on out-of-the-box ideas that are today's USP's for a brighter tomorrow. The soft launch, as it was called, was a curtain raiser to the immense possibilities that the LTC could offer to the students who choose to explore, innovate and learn by doing.



GUEST LECTURE SERIES

Loyola Technology Centre (LTC)

To promote the activities of the LTC and its functioning, the centre's resource personnel had lined up a series of guest lectures. The first guest lecture was by Dr Sujatha Ramdorai, a Mathematics researcher, who has served as a member of the National Knowledge Commission and was a member of the Prime Minister's Scientific Advisory Council. The topic dealt with was 'The Joy of Math'.

The event commenced on 13 August 2022 with around 53 participants, including teachers, parents and students. The guest speaker introduced the topic of math by quoting Galileo and Plato, making the audience aware that mathematics is as old as the earth itself. She went on to relate math with real life by giving various examples. She spoke about the subject in the concept of math modelling designing and simulation.



She made the audience know about the intel Pentium chip story and how the error was discovered by a Mathematician. The workshop concluded with a visit to the LTC-STEM lab where students and teachers got an opportunity to interact with the speaker.

The workshop had ended, the thinking just began. The teachers, parents and students knew that

it was the moment of opportunity to traverse through the boundaries of imagination, space and time and venture into the realm of some out-of-the-box thoughts and ideas, in a place connected with school and yet away from the classroom - a place called the LTC Lab!

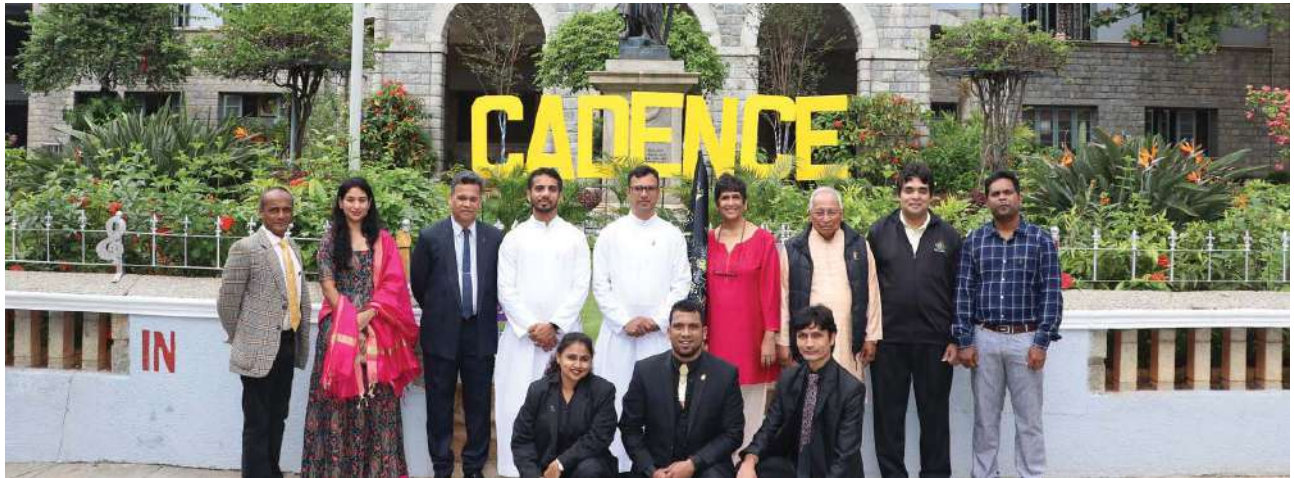

HIROSHIMA AND NAGASAKI MEMORIAL SERVICE

A World of Peace

The world as we know it today, is plagued with the haunting memories of the 1945 tragedy dropped on the Japanese cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, in the form of two atomic bombs. The devastation was colossal and the bombings remain the only use of nuclear weapons in armed conflict, till date. St Joseph's Boys' High School observed Hiroshima and Nagasaki Day on 18 August 2022 to promote peace, re-affirm faith in diplomacy and raise awareness about the catastrophic effects of the use of nuclear arsenal on the world as a whole.

Fr Vishal D'Souza SJ, the Administrator of the Primary section at SJBHS, welcomed the dignitaries warmly. The Chief Guest for the day was the Deputy Consul General of Japan in Bengaluru, Maruo Katsumasa, who delivered his speech stressing on the horrendous effects of the nuclear disaster in the Japanese cities and resolved to work with all the like-minded nations to rally against nuclear proliferation.



The special invitee to the memorial service, Mr Guy Kedem, founder of the Israeli Freedom Movement in Israel, in his message mentioned that the service was not all about the number of deaths during the 1945 bombing but the focus was on the fight against ideologies that encroach on a nation's freedom.

Another special invitee, Ms Ashwini Parthaiah, in her message spelt out the importance of enjoying every moment of our life and that can be achieved only if there is peace. She gave the students a broader perspective by citing examples of her work with refugees all over the world. Mr Daniel, who accompanied the dignitaries also shared his views.

The last speaker for the day was Fr Sunil Fernandes SJ, Principal of SJBHS, who put forth the fact that each one is called to be an ambassador of peace, harmony and reconciliation. He quoted various Holy books and re-iterated the idea of peace as taught in all religions. He called on the students to choose between the greater good and the lesser evil, when faced with difficult choices. The programme concluded with a signature drive to garner support for the propagation of peace in the world, the need for de-escalation of supremacy for world power and the urgent need for nuclear disarmament. The aim at the school level was to de-sensitize the students to violence, mindless destruction and the thought that 'might' is not always 'right'.

PARENTING SESSIONS

Challenges of Getting Back to School



Our founder, St Ignatius of Loyola's vision of 'Cura Personalis' or Care for the Person, guides and shapes school policy in all aspects of school life.

Apart from organizing webinars, creating a helpline with experienced counsellors and mentoring, the school has been initiating Positive Parenting sessions to build a bridge between home and school, between parents and teachers keeping the wellness of the child in mind. A session is held for each class of the school, from LKG to Std12. Each session is specially designed to cater to the issues which concern that particular age group. Parents of that particular class attend the one-hour session on the designated date. The four full time Counsellors of School along with Ms Gowri Achanta, a senior teacher at SJBHS, address the parents. They discuss the concerns of the parents, share their counselling experiences and offer help in different spheres. They also share the collective inputs of all the teachers of that class with the parents.



As children head back to school after the pandemic, parents and teachers have to know how to deal with several behavioural changes affecting them. Some of the topics covered were restlessness in class, learning gaps, lack of routine, inadequate social interaction, addiction to gadgets, no physical exercise, inability to focus for long periods. The inputs were well received and have been termed as an eye-opener for many parents who attended these sessions.

STAFF TWINNING PROGRAMME TO MANVI

A Learning for All

The state-board school in the Loyola campus at Manvi was the first destination for the visiting staff.

Later, the special educators conducted a teacher training programme on learning difficulties, identification and strategies to help the child with difficulties and some study skills that could be used to help the students in need for the entire staff of the state board school and a few representatives from the college.

The visitors spent the first half of day two at Xavier School. The general observation was that the students were well disciplined and eager to quench their thirst of knowledge. Being amidst the pre-primary and primary classes was quite overwhelming. The SJBHS teachers conducted different activities according to the age group while the special educators conducted a workshop for the teachers of the CBSE school. Case studies were discussed with the teachers which gave them better insight into the issues and coping strategies.

The second half of the second day was spent interacting with the middle school and high school

students! The teachers gave insights about the different cultures in Manvi. The special educators counselled students referred to them by the school and a session on mnemonic techniques was conducted for Class 8 students.

The students and teachers were delighted as they had a fruitful interaction. The trip had come to an end but the experience was inspiring and enriching.

The occasion was graced by the presence of Achim Burkhardt, the Consul General of the Federal Republic of Germany as the Chief Guest. Mr Burkhardt delivered an informative and inspirational speech which was followed by the introduction of each board member. The Secretary General, Aditya Vijay Kumar addressed the gathering present with much vigour and eloquence!



The 6 committees, namely, SOCHUM (Social Humanitarian and Cultural Committee) OPEC+ (Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries) FATF (Financial Action Task Force) CCC (Continuous Crisis Committee) UNSC (United Nations Security Council) began their proceedings with immense motivation, knowledge and utmost respect for the chair persons. The newer delegates were briefed about the rules and procedures of Model United Nations while the older, more experienced delegates spent this time, adding the finishing touches to their opening speeches.

All the committees dealt with agendas that tapped into various aspects, in both a geographical and sectoral sense. The Social Humanitarian and

Cultural Committee dealt with the concept of climate refugees, a part of the climate crisis which is often relegated to footnotes. The Lok Sabha, on the other hand, was tasked with a much more widely discussed topic - sedition. The OPEC+ dealt with the economics of the Oil and Petroleum markets, debating the sustainability of countries reliant on these fossil fuels and possible shifts to more sustainable methods. The CCC looked at terrorism from a different lens- one of the perpetrator. The FATF had an extremely nuanced agenda, block chain technology with regards to terror financing. The UNSC is the highlight of any conference and the delegates in this committee dealt with debt traps and financing of underdeveloped nations.



On day two, delegates of all committees delved deeper into their agendas as they were presented with a multitude of crisis. Displaying their ability to think on their feet, delegates solved these crises with creative and effective solutions. These solutions were solved through the process of passing professional documentation, giving delegates a much-needed insight into the legal process of policy and decision making.

On day three, the committees started their proceedings as soon as they could. Each committee was engaged in intense conversation of agendas and resolutions. The delegates were challenged by one another and every part of the organising committee was working as efficiently as they could to ensure smooth working till the very end of MUN.

The closing ceremony was held on 21 October 2022. A heartfelt song, recorded in-house by our ISC students called, 'Under The Sun, was played to accentuate the theme for the year 2022. A video that encapsulated the experiences of MUN during the course of the 3 days was played and a trailer to the upcoming cultural fest, Phenomenon, was shown. At the workshop, the students were given a theoretical understanding of the world of fungi and were equipped with all they needed to know about

cultivating mushrooms. The students also learnt how to create sustainable, zero-waste ways to cultivate mushrooms at home, which enabled them to turn common household wastes, coffee grounds, mulch, leaf litter, and cardboard into healthy nutritious food. Working in groups of 3, the students got to make their own mini mushroom farm which was later stored for observation. The workshop concluded with students from various schools learning new concepts which set an idea of sustainability running in their minds and will lead to making plans to support the cause in the future society.

OUTREACH PROGRAMME FOR STD X STUDENTS

Visit to Anekal: Reaching the Unreached

The school organised an outreach programme for the students of Class X with the theme being, 'Reaching the Unreached'. To provide a foretaste of what lay in wait for them, a seminar by Fr Jerald D'Souza was conducted on the 23 November. Critical reflection on the Indian society highlighting all the problems plaguing the Indian society namely: the divide between the rich and the poor, illiteracy and several similar challenges, was the essence of this briefing.

Often, we, the 'So-Called Civilized Urban', have misconstrued notions about rural areas and villagers but the students of St Joseph's Boys' High School were pleasantly surprised after interacting with the people of Gowramma Village during the Outreach Programme. With only two

schools operating in the village and virtually no hospitals, Gowramma Village paints a bleak picture at first glance. However, the more we delve into the lives of these humble villagers, more complexity and beauty are unravelled!

Ms Nayana from Gowramma village answered all the questions posed by the students with quick wit and dexterity, completely unfazed by the most awkward and personal questions. This reflects the determination and sheer grit the villagers have. Though the village is plagued with economic problems, drainage and sanitary issues, lack of healthcare facilities and immediate access to medical aid, they have handled these challenges to the best of their abilities.



Gowramma Village introduced a more important problem to the students: certain social problems that are prevalent. Even though there is no discord between different religions, dowry exists in reality. Women are not allowed to enter cemeteries and superstitious beliefs curtail the development of this village. Despite these traits of gender inequality, the most unique thing was the fact that four women-led organisations dominate the village in terms of bringing in a positive change. They provide skill training to teach women tailoring. The arrange for low-interest loans, provide free education and much more. One key aspect that even the children of this village are taught is the art of saving money,

Gowramma was a melting pot of religions, cultures and practices but one thing commonly seen in all the villagers and something the students imbibed from this learning opportunity was that education is key to breaking the cycle of poverty, illiteracy and suffering. It was indeed an experience to treasure!

The primary aim of this session was to introduce students to these harsh realities while also offering a conducive environment to brainstorm implementable solutions and methods to help society in an altruistic manner.

Treasures of the Past...

3rd April 2023 was a Red- Letter Day in the history of SJBHS. A museum dedicated to the 165 year old history of our school was inaugurated by former Principal Rev Fr Michael John SJ. It was almost a year ago that the process of setting up a museum began. Our Principal Fr Sunil Fernandes entrusted Fr Vishal D'Souza, the Primary Administrator with the task of leading a team to set up a museum. Old, rare and precious artefacts were gathered over the period of a few months and stored in a room in the Sports Complex. Old Boy, Darius Billimoria, an architect, guided the team through the various stages and the Museum gradually took shape. The OBA generously helped with information and loaned precious pictures from its collection. Old Boy, Brian D'Lima helped gather memorabilia from other Old Boys. The Museum team consisting of Ms Gowri Mirlay Achanta, History teacher,

Mr Fabian White, Old Boy and Music teacher, Ms. Maria Judy and Ms. Lynette from the Primary Section worked enthusiastically restoring old cupboards, grandfather clocks and trophies. Interesting documents include a Transfer Certificate from 1886, a working projector from the 1890s, an 80-year-old School Calendar and a Teacher's appointment letter from 1937. The inaugural ceremony was witnessed by several Old Boys and the Coordinators. The four house songs and a full version of the school song were a big draw as also was the grand piano and the working grand father clock. Pictures of the museum were shared instantly on several groups as well as on heritage groups of Bangalore. The museum will move to a bigger place in a few years and will surely grow with contributions pouring in from all over the world. A wonderful beginning indeed to what is a unique contribution to the heritage of the school.



UNDERSTANDING THE AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER AND SUPPORTING THEM IN THE CLASSROOM.

In keeping with the requirements of NEP, which mandates that every child gets a 'barrier-free' access to education and gives them equal access to all aspects of learning, SJBHS organized a two-day workshop on "Understanding the Autism Spectrum Disorder and Supporting them in the Classroom" for the teachers of the pre-primary department, members of Pragati Resource Room and the school counselors on 27th and 28th of March 2023. The guest speaker was Ms Preeja Balan Ph.D. (Speech Language Pathology), co-founder and director of the Octave Hearing and Speech Centre.

With the help of visual aids like video clips, picture cards and slides, Ms Preeja Balan gave tips and insights on how to implement alternative augmentative and alternative communication system in children with communication impairments and other difficulties. The session was made interactive with group activities and question and answer rounds.



The two days of workshop on Autism Spectrum-Disorder was indeed a great learning for the participants who were able to acquire a better understanding of autism, its signs and symptoms, the role teachers can play in schools to address it and the strategies they can adopt in order to help the children be at par with their counterparts

SIX BRICKS TEACHERS TRAINING PROGRAMME

In order to stay up to date and be in line with the NEP policy, the management of SJBHS organised a Six Bricks Training Programme on 29th March 2023. The programme was conducted by Mr Mrunal Shah, founder of 'Sunday Bricks' and a certified trainer at the Lego Foundation, Denmark. The session was attended by the teachers of the Pre-Primary Department and a few Primary School teachers as it pertained to the age group they deal with. It was a six-hour workshop about the six differently coloured Duplo bricks and its other properties and how to use those six bricks as a

learning aid to make learning possible through play.

The workshop not only helped the teachers be at par with the NEP policy but also taught them to take care of the overall development of the child and uphold the Jesuit ethos of 'Cura Personalis.'

OBA REPORT

June 2022 to May 2023

The new academic year began with the return of students to the school after a 2-year hiatus. This was a welcome change that recharged all of us. We began the activities for this academic year continuing on from where we left off in the previous year.

The War Memorial Service was conducted on 1st July to honour two old boys who served in the Indian Air Force and made the supreme sacrifice in the wars against Pakistan. Justice Arindam Sinha of the Orissa High Court and Mrs. Kavitha Mohan were among other family members of the fallen air warriors who graced the event. A Motivational bus from the Indian Air Force was brought to the school to showcase the Indian Air Force to the students of class 10 and 12. Plaques were erected in the school and salvers presented to the family members and Units of the fallen air warriors. Wreaths were placed at the War Memorial in front of the school. 500 students, 120 teachers and about 100 others including Old Boys (both retired and currently serving) in the armed forces were in attendance.

The OBA Buzz has always been much awaited and ran from August 01-05. Events were clubbed together to accommodate the school curriculum (given that the school has increased commitments on the cultural front). This ensured that classes were not disrupted. The Corona hiatus had done nothing to diminish the students' spirits. A record of approximately 130 students registered for the creative writing and more than 250 students for the other events. The OBA MC and some Old Boys went the extra mile to train the younger students in the art of debating et al and record attendances for the Quiz prelims were witnessed and most appreciated by the students and staff alike.

The OBA has plans to facilitate workshops to bolster the literary and Dramatics Clubs going forward all year around subject to the teachers buying into the concept.

The OBA has also been actively associated with and supports the school in various sporting activities like football, hockey and basketball, and if recent school victories are any indication, we are headed in the right direction. Breakfast and other refreshments were provided to all school teams this year.

The Annual Prize Day was held on 27 August. Academic achievers of the previous academic year were honoured with certificates and cash prizes for their achievements in various subjects.

The OBA Blue & White Ball was held on 3 September 2022 at the Taj West End and saw an attendance of about 500 alumni and their families. The Annual General Body Meeting of the OBA and elections to the Managing Committee of 2022-23 were held on 4th September, 2022 (OBA Day). The present Managing Committee was unanimously re elected.

On 9 September, the OBA facilitated a Teachers' Counselling and Enhancement Programme titled "Grassroots" catering to the emotional well being of teachers and conducted by Ms. Jahnvi Gurjer, spouse of an Old Boy.

An interactive session for all the teachers was held in the school auditorium on September 22 to explain to them how their insurance fund is handled and to clarify issues and doubts. TPA providers and insurance industry personnel who handle our policy were present to explain and field questions. A follow up meeting was also arranged on November 23 to facilitate teachers to avail higher medical insurance coverage through the TPA providers and the overall Base Plan has been increased from 2 lakhs to 3 lakhs cover with top-ups optional.

The OBA Centenary Football Tournament for the alumni was held on 29th October, 2022. About 350 players across 34 teams spanning 4 decades took part in the event, which saw a footfall of over 500.

The Coorg Connect was held at the Capitol Village on 12 November 2022 after a gap of 3 years. The Connect was well received with over 15 registrations for the Golf Tournament that ended with a sumptuous lunch at the Madikeri Downs Golf Club. The evening programme at Capitol Village was blessed with good weather and had over 60 Old Boys in attendance.

The OBA Jimmy Anklesaria Cricket Tournament and the OBA Cynthia Britto Basketball Tournament were held on 10th December. Thirty-two teams across batches took part in the day-long event and saw an attendance of about 400 plus alumni. However, inclement weather forced to push the completion of the tournament to 22 January 2023. The Inaugural Chennai Connect was held at the Madras Alumni Club on 4 December, 2022. About 30 Old Boys across 5 decades attended the meet which started with singing of the School Anthem and followed by a fellowship lunch.

On 16 December, 2022 the Loyola Technology Centre was inaugurated by the Honourable Governor of Karnataka, Shri. Thaawarchand Gehlot. A good number of Old Boys attended the event. This event was followed by the Christmas Dinner the same evening. The residents of Jesuit Nivas and senior teachers were special invitees of the OBA. The event saw a record attendance of about 250 Old Boys and Girls with their families.

The traditional Welcome to the OBA was held on 25th January 2023 and clubbed along with the Josexcel Awards for the graduating students of 2023. Two Old Boys, namely Arvind Mani and Avinash Mani, were recognized and honoured for their past sporting achievements and inducted into the Josexcel Wall of Fame. A third Old Boy, Noel Wilson was also inducted into the Josexcel Wall of Fame since he has already received the Significant Achievement Award earlier.

Students who excelled in various sports were honoured at the event. For the first time the OBA honoured students of Std XII who excelled at the CISCE State sports or achieved National acclaim. The students were welcomed into the OBA fold by President Dr. Praveen Rodrigues. Old Girl Roshni Gera of the 2013 batch and Darshana of the 2019 batch addressed the students. Each of the students was given a Certificate of Membership, lapel pin and a snack box.

The OBA won the prestigious JAAI Social Champion Award at the Patna Meet of the JAAI held from 10 to 12 February, 2023. The award is only one of 4 awards and the OBA is the only institution to have won an individual award in Bangalore.

The Delhi Connect was held on 18 - 19 February. About 30 Old Boys and their families attend the event. The event started with a round of golf for the golfers at the Qutub Golf Course and included visits to the Mughal Gardens in the Rashtrapati Bhavan, Red Fort and the Delhi Metro followed by a fellowship lunch. Our heartfelt gratitude to Past President Nadeem Ahmed for donating the biriyani on the occasion.

They were accompanied by Principal Fr. Sunil Fernandes SJ, Vice Principal Mr. Brian McKertish, and Primary School Administrator Fr. Vishal D'Souza SJ.

Children's Day was made extra special for our young students with the distribution of chocolate doughnuts and juices. The pre-primary and primary students received greeting cards with personalized messages from their class teachers, making them feel truly cherished.

Phenomenon provided an exciting opportunity for budding teenagers to participate in over 30 engaging and unique events, culminating in an evening festival of music. This highly anticipated fest took place on November 18 and 19 after a two-year hiatus due to the pandemic. The event generated proceeds of 5 lakhs, which were donated to the Teachers' Insurance Fund, and the remainder was donated to Manvi Mission, Anekal, and Loyola, schools run by the Jesuits, serving under privileged children. The Phenomenon Raffle Draw was conducted during a school assembly in the third week of January 2023.

In January 2023, a comprehensive Health Checkup was organized for students from LKG to Std 12, with doctors from St. John's Medical College leading the examinations. Additionally, a thorough dental checkup was conducted by the Dental Health Organization. The reports were digitized and the results were uploaded on Pupilpod for easy access.

To conclude the year on a fitting note, a Triathlon was held for students in Std 7, 8, and 9. This swim-cycle-run event took place on an early Saturday morning, February 11, with participants required to report at 5:30 am. All three sports were successfully organized on the school grounds with the support of parents and the school administration. Nearly 200 students participated with great enthusiasm and were felicitated at a school assembly to recognize their achievements.

We extend a heartfelt thank you to the teachers and parents of the PTA team for their dedicated time and effort throughout the year. With the continued support of the broader parent community and the school management, we are committed to planning and conducting more enriching activities for our students in the upcoming academic year.

The Ruminaton of a Josephite

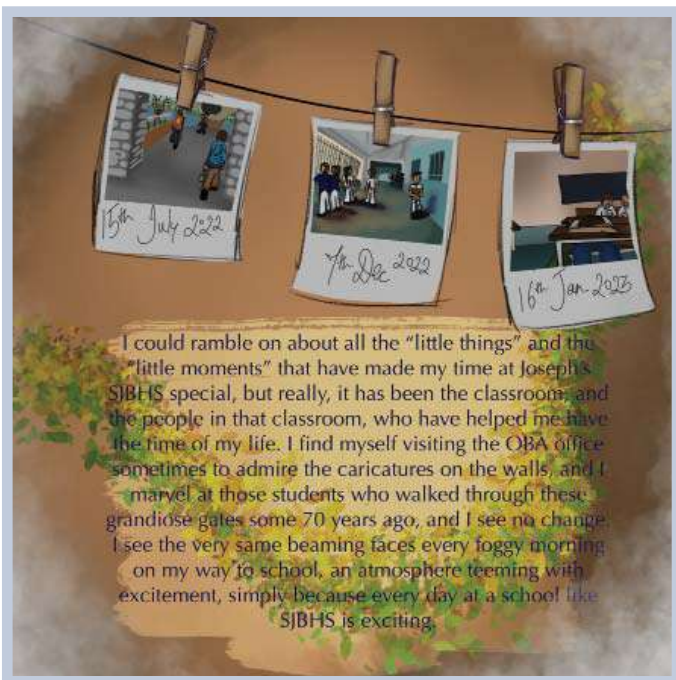
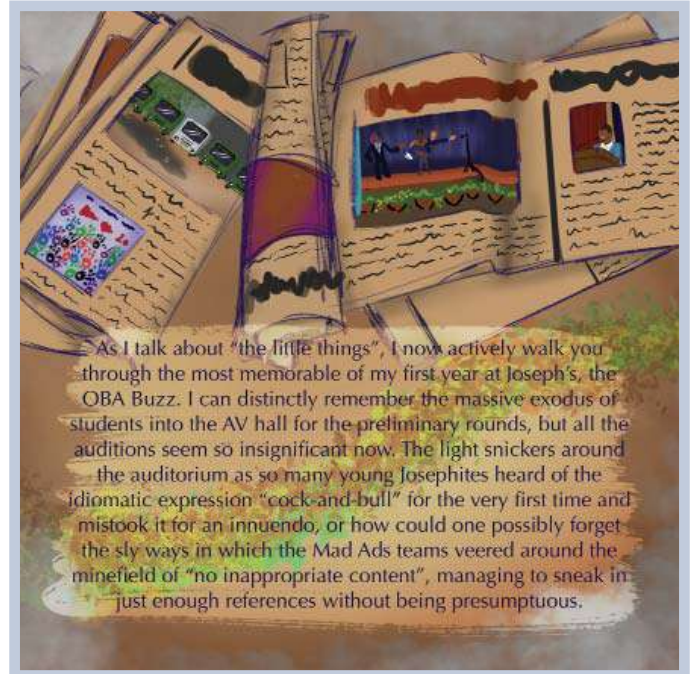

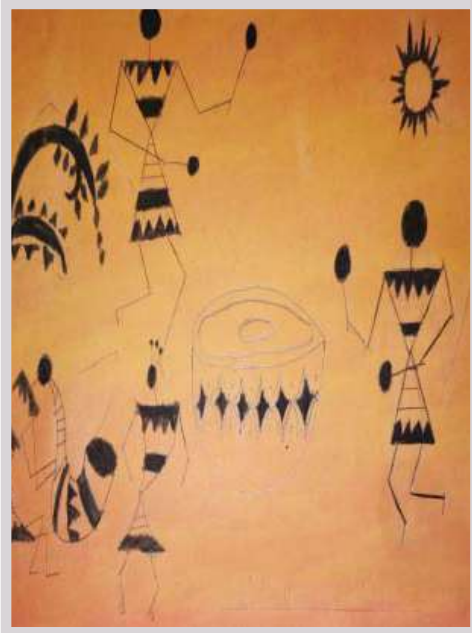

Steadying each other through the turbulence.

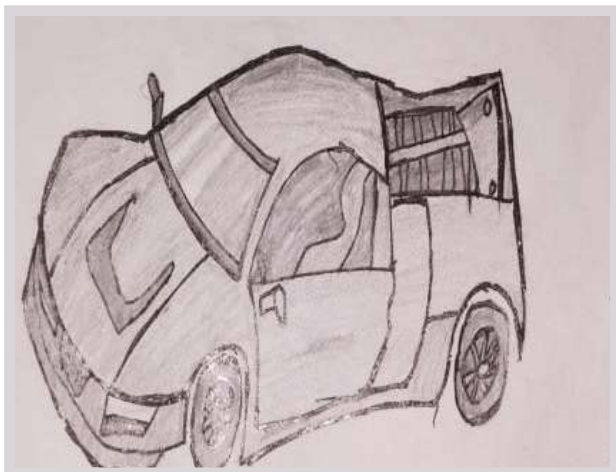
How many memories am I made of?

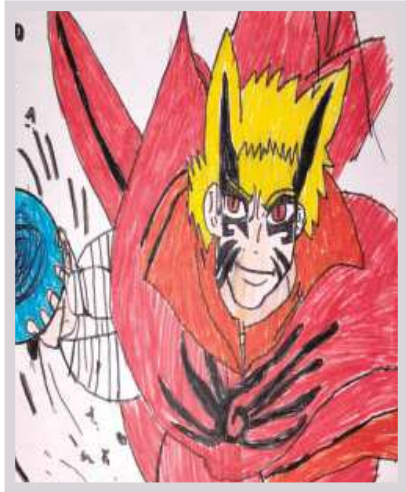
Êtes-vous stressé?
