

We sincerely thank God for blessing our school with a 100% success rate in the ICSE and ISC examinations in 2025, a testament to our unwavering commitment to academic excellence. Congratulations to our dedicated students, supportive parents, committed staff, and the entire administration for their relentless efforts throughout the academic year.

In the ICSE exam, 251 students appeared. 162 students secured distinction, 74 secured a 1st class, 14 secured a 2nd class, and 1 got a 3rd class.

The ICSE toppers (overall percentage of all 6 subjects) are: in first place, Haripreeth U T with 98.16%; in second place, Rayhaan Mansoor with 98%; and in third place, Hruthik Gowda with 97.83%.

The toppers according to the national ranking, calculating the overall percentage of English + the best 4 subjects, are Haripreeth U T and Rayhaan Mansoor in 1st place with 98.20%, Hruthik Gowda in 2nd place with 97.80%, and Sanath Kothari in 3rd place with 97.20%.

In the ISC Science section, out of 74 students who appeared, 65 secured distinction, 8 secured a first, and 1 secured a second class.

According to the overall percentage of all 5 subjects, the school toppers are Ashrith Puppala in 1st place with 98.2%, Liza Sarah Sajith in 2nd place with 97.2%, and Sugandha Gupta in 3rd place with 97%.

The toppers according to the national ranking, calculating the overall percentage of English plus the best 3 subjects, are Ashrith Puppala in 1st place with 98.5%, Liza Sarah Sajith and Priyamvada Choudhary in 2nd place with 97.75%, and Sugandha Gupta, Felicia Andrew and Naman Agarwal in 3rd place with 97.25%.

In the ISC Commerce section, out of 158 students who appeared, 132 secured distinction, 24 secured a first class, and 2 students got a second class. According to the overall percentage of all 5 subjects, the school toppers are Soham Milind Joglekar in 1st place with 99.2%, Rhea Rosa Cyriac in 2nd place with 96.4%, and Rishika Agarwal in 3rd place with 96%.

The toppers according to the national ranking, calculating the overall percentage of English plus the best 3 subjects, are Soham Milind Joglekar in 1st place with 99.25%, Rishika Agarwal in 2nd place with 98%, and Rhea Rosa Cyriac in 3rd place with 96.75%.






HONOURING N. A. SOONAWALA



The Introduction to Design Thinking Workshop

June 21st, 2024

An Introduction to Design Thinking workshop was conducted for 40 students from Grades 7 to 12, offering a hands-on learning experience. The session was led by design thinking experts Mr Shashi Lewis and Mr Sumit Bedi, who guided participants through the key stages of the design thinking process—Empathy, Define, Ideate, Prototype, and Test. Through interactive activities, discussions, and prototype creation,

students actively explored creative problem-solving and teamwork.

The workshop received positive feedback, with participants gaining practical skills and a deeper understanding of the relevance of design thinking across disciplines. The programme was graced by JTF representative Dr Thomas K Philip; the Principal, Fr Sunil Fernandes; the Vice Principal, Mr Brian Mckertish and Ms Gowri Achanta.

The Arduino Workshop

August 16th, 2024

The Arduino workshop was conducted in the school campus for 20 students of Grades 7 and 8. The session was led by Mr Thomas Philip from the JTF Foundation, who introduced students to the basics of electronics, coding, and programming using the Arduino UNO (R3).

Students worked in groups with Arduino boards and components to build and code beginner-level projects, gaining practical exposure to programming and problem-solving. Guided troubleshooting sessions helped participants overcome challenges and build confidence while exploring the creative possibilities of the Arduino platform.



Automation Anywhere Workshop

September 14th, 2024

The Loyola Technology Centre hosted a hands-on workshop on Automation, led by industry experts Mr Arjun Meda and Mr Krishna from Automation Anywhere. The programme was inaugurated by Dr Thomas Philip and Vice Principal Mr Brian Mckertish and saw enthusiastic participation from students of St Joseph's Boys' High School and St Joseph's PU College.

The interactive workshop introduced students to the fundamentals of automation through the creation of task-performing bots and game-playing bots. Working in teams, participants applied automation concepts in a practical setting, strengthening their problem-solving, collaboration, and creative thinking skills. The speakers also highlighted the growing impact of automation across industries and its significance in shaping the future workforce.

The session sparked keen interest and active engagement among students, making it an enriching learning experience that broadened their understanding of automation and its real-world applications.

The Arduino Workshop for Boarding Students at St Joseph's Indian High School

December 3rd, 2024

An engaging, hands-on Arduino workshop was conducted by Dr Thomas Philip at St Joseph's Indian High School for boarding students. The workshop aimed to introduce students to the fundamentals of electronics, programming, and problem-solving using the Arduino platform. The session began with an introduction to Arduino and the Arduino UNO (R3), followed by a beginner-level blink project. Working in groups, students used Arduino boards and electronic components to code and execute their projects. Guided troubleshooting sessions helped them overcome challenges, strengthening their logical thinking and technical confidence.



The interactive format promoted teamwork, peer learning, and curiosity-driven exploration. By the end of the workshop, students had successfully programmed their boards and gained valuable hands-on experience in coding and hardware integration, leaving them inspired to pursue further learning in STEM.

The programme was graced by Dr Thomas K. Philip, JTF mentor, along with Fr Joseph D'Souza, Rector of St Joseph's Indian Institutes; Fr Norwin Pereira, the Primary Administrator, St Joseph's Boys' High School; Mr Chris Rego; Mr Stephen K. Nebu, LTC Coordinator; and Ms Harshitha.



The Homi Bhabha Exam

December, 22nd 2024

Students from St Joseph's Boys' High School, Sophia High School, Lourdes School, St Joseph's Indian High School, Loyola High School (Bannerghatta Road), and St Joseph's School CBSE enthusiastically participated in the prestigious Homi Bhabha Science Exam for Grades 6 and 9.

The students were trained by Mr Stephen K Nebu, LTC Coordinator, and Ms Harshitha Ramu through regular online sessions that included quizzes, debates, and peer learning, enabling a strong conceptual understanding. The written examination, held on 30th November 2024, witnessed commendable performance, with nearly 60% of the participants qualifying. Notably, 13 students from St Joseph's Boys' High School advanced to the practical round.

Following further training at the Loyola Technology Centre, the qualified students appeared for the practical examination in Mumbai in January 2025. One student progressed to the prestigious Research Round, marking a significant achievement.



The Mushroom Cultivation Workshop

January 24th, 2025

A hands-on mushroom cultivation workshop was conducted by Mr Jashid Hameed from Nuvedo Labs, offering students practical exposure to sustainable farming practices. The interactive session introduced participants to the fundamentals of mushroom cultivation, including different mushroom species, substrate preparation, sterilisation, and spore inoculation.

Each student received an individual cultivation kit and actively participated in setting up growth environments and monitoring optimal conditions. Guided troubleshooting sessions helped students overcome real-time challenges, strengthening their problem-solving skills and building confidence in applying scientific techniques. The workshop sparked curiosity and encouraged scientific exploration, making it a meaningful experiential learning opportunity.



Twinning School Program- Loyola High School, Bannerghatta

February 5th, 2024

On 5th February 2025, educators from Loyola Technology Centre (LTC), Mr Stephen K Nebu and Ms Harshitha R, visited Loyola High School, Bannerghatta Road, to introduce students to hands-on science learning and explore avenues for future collaboration.

The team was warmly welcomed by Principals Fr Jerald Furtado and Ms Gracy, along with the Coordinator, Mr Suraj. Mr Stephen conducted an interactive session on the basics of electricity, where students learned about open and closed circuits and built simple circuits using batteries and buzzers. A follow-up activity reinforced their understanding through application-based learning. Students worked enthusiastically in teams, demonstrating curiosity, collaboration, and problem-solving skills. To encourage continued exploration, each student was provided with basic circuit components for independent learning.

The visit concluded with a constructive discussion with school leadership on integrating LTC programmes into the curriculum and establishing a dedicated space for science and innovation. The interaction marked a positive step towards strengthening collaboration between LTC and Loyola High School to enrich students' experiential learning in science and technology.



Twinning Programme - Loyola Kendriya Vidyalaya and Loyola Higher Primary School

February 21st, 2025

An engaging, hands-on Electricity Workshop was conducted at Loyola Kendriya Vidyalaya and Loyola Primary High School for both Kannada and English medium students. The workshop introduced foundational concepts of electricity through interactive discussions, experiments, and real-world applications.

Students worked in groups using kits containing wires, bulbs, batteries, and switches to build simple circuits and test materials as conductors and insulators. The collaborative activities encouraged teamwork, curiosity, and problem-solving. Notably, students who were initially hesitant gained confidence and actively explained their observations to peers.

The session ensured maximum participation and enthusiasm, making learning enjoyable while fostering critical thinking and a deeper understanding of basic electrical concepts.

Twining Programme - Manvi

February 28th, 2025

On 28th February, Mr Stephen K Nebu from Loyola Technology Centre visited Loyola School Manvi, Loyola Kapepaladi School, Pannur, and Xavier School Manvi to engage students in hands-on STEM learning. The school principals play a vital role in supporting teachers and students through training programmes in English, communication, and life skills, creating a conducive learning environment.

During the visit, Mr Nebu interacted closely with the students and highlighted the importance of mathematics in everyday life and problem-solving. Using the story One Grain of Rice, students were guided to solve a mathematical challenge while also learning new vocabulary and values such as honesty, care, love, and responsibility.

The programme was supported by Loyola High School Principal, Fr Cyril Raj and Sr Juliet; Xavier School Principal, Fr Wilson Bennis; Loyola Kapepaladi School Principal, Fr Rayappa and Sr Reena, along with teachers Ms Arogya Lobo, Ms Harsha Mr Nagaraj and Mr Anukul.

Twining Programme- Manvi

March 7th, 2025

An engaging, hands-on Pythagorean Theorem workshop was conducted for the entire Grade 7 cohort at St Joseph's School, Pandithahalli, with 50 students participating. The session made mathematics interactive and enjoyable through practical activities and real-life applications.

Students explored the theorem by creating right-angled triangles using paper, measuring sides, and verifying the hypotenuse. They further applied their learning by identifying real-life examples around the campus, including calculating the hypotenuse of a bent ladder. Teamwork and peer discussions fostered problem-solving, confidence, and active participation.

Twining Programme- Hassan

March 5, 2025

On 5th March, Mr Stephen K Nebu from Loyola Technology Centre (LTC) visited St Joseph's Primary and High School and St Joseph's College, Hassan, to engage students in hands-on STEM learning and explore future collaboration.

Students from Grades 5 to 9 participated in an interactive session on mathematics and its real-life applications, illustrated through the story One Grain of Rice, encouraging teamwork and problem-solving. Mr Nebu also interacted with PUC I science students, guiding them on career pathways and essential skills for higher education. Students showcased STEM-based experiments conducted during the year, including a decomposition experiment using kitchen waste to produce fertile manure.

The visit reinforced the importance of experiential STEM education and opened discussions on establishing an LTC STEM Lab at the school. The programme was supported by High School Principal, Fr Henry Saldhana; Primary School Principal, Fr Cyril Castelino; PU College Principal, Fr Melvin Mendonca; and teachers Ms Jennifer, Ms Asma and Ms Suma.

LTC Club Peer Learning Initiative - STEM for Smaller Grades

January and February, 2025

Under the guidance of Mr Stephen K Nebu, students of the LTC Club from Classes 6 and 9 took the initiative to engage younger students through peer-led science demonstrations. Class 6 students Dhruv, Rian Edwald, and Yashas visited primary classes to explain acids and bases through simple, hands-on activities that sparked curiosity and enthusiastic interaction.

Class 9 students Nithin Tony, Diyan Khan, Sachin, Khush, Nihal, Advik and Akrit conducted engaging experiments for middle school students, including the simple pendulum, sound as energy, and filtration. These sessions brought scientific concepts to life while encouraging inquiry and discussion.

The initiative not only ignited curiosity among younger learners but also empowered LTC Club students as confident mentors and leaders, showcasing the value of learning through teaching.

The Egg Incubation

January, 2025

Students, Abu Bakar (Class 8) and Zain (Class 11), participated in a hands-on learning experience on the life cycle of a chicken at the LTC Lab. Using an incubator, students observed eggs hatch into chicks, with nearly 70% successfully hatching. They learned to care for the chicks by feeding them, keeping them warm, and ensuring their safety. The activity helped students understand the importance of kindness, responsibility, and respect for living beings. Students later shared their learning with visitors from Grades 1 to 4, explaining the process and answering questions with enthusiasm.

The school extends its gratitude to Mr Shashi Lewis for providing the incubator and to mentors Mr Stephen K Nebu and Ms Harshitha R for their guidance and support in making this enriching experience possible.

LTC Students Shine at Homi Bhabha Science Exam

March, 2025

Three of our LTC students excelled in the prestigious Homi Bhabha Science Talent Search Examination:

- Manvith (St Joseph's Indian Primary School) – Gold Medal
- Aiden (St Joseph's Boys' High School) – Silver Medal
- Neha (Sophia High School) – Bronze Medal

The competition challenged students to apply scientific knowledge through experiments and problem-solving. Guided by mentors at Loyola Technology Centre, the students not only performed exceptionally but also gained valuable hands-on learning experience. Their success inspires continued exploration and a passion for science.

Student Internship at IISc

19th–30th May 2025

Rachel Vinod, Class 11, participated in an internship at the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) from 19th to 30th May, organized by the Department of Mechanical Engineering under the mentorship of Dr Saptarshi Basu. The program brought together 26 students aged 14–17 from across India, providing a unique opportunity to engage with advanced engineering research.

The project focused on flame flickering, examining oscillations in diffusion flames caused by buoyancy-induced instabilities. Mornings were dedicated to lab sessions introducing fundamental concepts and experimental techniques, while afternoons were used for hands-on experiments and data analysis. Using high-speed videos and software like ImageJ, students investigated how airflow, flame size, and fuel type affected flame stability, gaining insight into the precision and repeatability required in fluid mechanics research.

The internship also included visits to the Biomechanics Lab, Microfluidics Lab, and Microscopy Lab, offering exposure to diverse, cutting-edge research at IISc. Interaction with peers and mentors fostered collaborative learning and highlighted how even small phenomena can reveal complex scientific principles.







Conclusion
